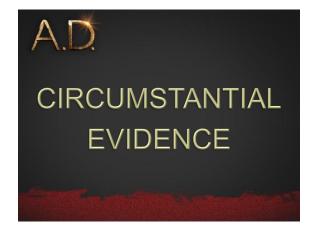

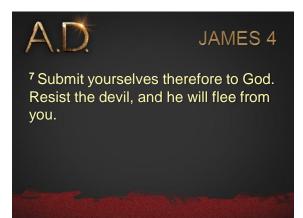
### ACTS 8
